ORDER OF THE SECRETARY
GOVERNING AUCTION MARKETS, LIVE BIRD MARKETS AND OTHER
MARKETS WHERE POULTRY IS BROUGHT FOR EXHIBITION OR SALE

WHEREAS, Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (“HPAI”) is a contagious and infectious animal disease that can devastate the economically important Maryland poultry industry,

WHEREAS, there has been an outbreak of Avian Influenza in certain other states, which has resulted in the destruction of flocks in those states,

WHEREAS the movement and commingling of poultry for any purpose within, into and out of the State poses a high risk of disease spread,

WHEREAS a process for tracing the movement of birds to sites of commingling for sale and subsequent dispersal is needed,

NOW THEREFORE pursuant to Agriculture Article, §§ 3-101 *et seq.*, Annotated Code of Maryland, the Secretary of the Maryland Department of Agriculture, on this 10th day of 2016, hereby issues this new Order, supplementing the previous Order issued on July 22, 2015 (Order #01-2015):

- A. Terms defined. For the purposes of this amended Order, the following terms have the meanings indicated:
- (1) Auction Market” means any place where a producer, dealer, wholesaler, distributor or retailer meet to purchase or sell live poultry or hatching eggs at auction, that has been approved by the USDA and MDA to operate as an auction market.


- (2) "Department" means the Maryland Department of Agriculture.
- (3) "HPAI" means Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza.
- (4) "Hatching eggs" means fertile eggs that can be incubated and hatched.
- (5) "Live Bird Market" means any facility (including botanica, poultry store, or custom slaughter) that sells live poultry for onsite slaughter or for offsite ritual use.
- (6) "Other Market" means a place to purchase, sell, barter poultry or their hatching eggs including but not limited to farmers' markets, flea markets, swap meets, botanicas and internet web-sites, but is not approved by the United States Department of Agriculture as an approved livestock facility.
- (7) "Poultry" means any domesticated fowl, of any age, including but not limited to chickens, turkeys, ostriches, emus, rheas, cassowaries, waterfowl, and game birds, and including hatching eggs.

B. Auction Market, Live Bird Market, and Other Market.

- (1) A person who operates an auction market, live bird market or other market where poultry is brought for sale that is located in Maryland shall comply with the following requirements:
 - (a) Register under the Maryland Poultry Registration Program;
 - (b) Notify the Department in writing, providing the name, place, and inclusive dates and hours of the event at least 30 days before the event, unless notice has otherwise been provided to MDA in the USDA approval process for Auction Markets.
 - (c) For the period of time specified in (d) below, keep the following records for each sale or purchase of poultry:
 - (i) The name, address, phone number of the buyer and seller;
 - (ii) The quantity, type, species of poultry bought and sold;
 - (iii) Official identification if applied; and
 - (iv) The date of the transaction;
 - (d) Maintain the records noted in (c) above for one year from the date of each transaction, except auction markets and live bird markets, which shall maintain these records for three years from the date of each transaction;
 - (e) Allow the Department to have access to and to copy any required records during regular business hours;
- (2) The Secretary may order diagnostic testing or other actions deemed necessary to control the introduction and spread of Avian Influenza or other contagious

or infectious poultry diseases at an auction market, live bird market or other market.

- C. Duration. This Order takes effect immediately and shall be effective through June 30, 2016 unless the danger of additional disease has passed and it is revoked earlier by the Secretary of Agriculture.
- D. Violations. A person who violates this Order is subject to criminal and administrative penalties as provided under Maryland law. In addition, The Secretary of Agriculture may impose a quarantine order on any poultry, hatching eggs, eggs or nest-run eggs found in this State in violation of this Order.
