

A Brief Introduction to the **Farmers Market Nutrition Program Checks** (FMNP & SFMNP) & Fruit & Vegetable Checks (FVC)

Farmers' Market Nutrition Program (FMNP) Overview

- The FMNP is a USDA Supplemental Nutrition Grant Program
- The USDA gives grants to state agencies to provide checks to low-income participants
- Two FMNP programs funded: Women, Infants and Children (WIC) (FMNP) and Seniors (SFMNP)
- Checks can be used to buy fresh fruits, vegetables, cut herbs and honey (Seniors only) at farmers' markets
- In 2015, farmers received more than \$449,000 through the two programs.

How the FMNP Programs Work



MDA provides checks to DHMH & DOA



DOA distributes checks to eligible Seniors



DHMH distributes checks to eligible WIC participants



Participants use checks to buy produce from FMNP authorized farmers at markets

Participant Information

Must qualify based on income (185% of federal poverty level)

Must have proof of residency in Maryland

WIC - \$20

- O Applicants must be pregnant women, infants, or children up to 5 years and have a nutritional need
- O WIC participants receive nutrition education, breastfeeding support, health screenings & referrals to other community support programs
- O Can sign up at WIC clinics

SENIORS - \$30

- O Applicants must be 60 or over
- O Must certify income eligibility on application form
- O Can sign up at participating Senior Centers

Farmer Eligibility & Registration

- Authorized FMNP Farmers must meet the following standards:
- 1. The farmer must complete the Maryland FMNP Farmer Application & Agreement.
- 2. The farmer must agree to abide by all FMNP rules.
- 3. The farmer must sell fruits, vegetables and/or cut herbs and honey (seniors only) grown only in Maryland, Virginia, West Virginia, Delaware or Pennsylvania at a Maryland Farmers Market.
- 4. The farmer must not accept FMNP checks for agricultural produce obtained from wholesale distributors. FMNP checks can only be accepted as payment for produce grown by the authorized farmer.
- 5. The farmer must be in compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local governmental laws and regulations and obtain all necessary licenses and permits.

Farmer Application & Agreement is due to Shelby Watson **no later than April 30**.



WIC & SFMNP Key Dates

April 30: Farmer FMNP applications due

June – July: Checks issued to eligible

participants (WIC & Seniors)

June 1: First date that farmers may

accept checks at markets or on-

farm stands

November 30: Last date that farmers may

accept checks at markets or on-

farm stands

December 5: Last date that farmers may

deposit checks for 2014 season



WIC: Eligible foods include all locally grown fruits, vegetables and cut herbs except honey grown by the authorized farmer. Eligible foods may not be processed or prepared beyond their natural state except for usual harvesting and cleaning processes.

Seniors: all of the above + honey



Farmers who are authorized to accept FMNP may also accept WIC FVC checks


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Only a small percentage of FVCs are redeemed at farmers markets; the majority are accepted at authorized grocery stores.

Farmers must participate in FMNP to accept FVCs.

There are important differences between the FMNP checks and the WIC FVC.

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Comparison Between WIC Fruit & Vegetable Checks (FVC) and Farmers' Market Nutrition Program (FMNP) Checks

Deposit Procedure	Check needs to be deposited within 30 days of the last date-to-spend on check	Farmers can deposit checks anytime between June 1 and December 5			
	Farmer responsible for returned check charges if returned by the bank	Farmer responsible for returned check charges if returned by the bank			
Agreement with the State	Each individual farmer must have a signed written agreement with the State WIC Program	Each individual farmer must have a signed written agreement with the MD Dept of Agriculture once every three years and provide locations to MDA annually			
Training	Each farmer must attend training on regulations and procedures with WIC FVC	Each farmer must attend training on regulations and procedures with FMNP in first year of program participation, and every three years thereafter
