#### **MEMORANDUM**

**TO:** Interested Parties

**FROM:** Edward A. Crow

**SUBJECT:** Courses That Meet Initial Certification Requirements

The Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA) has approved several college courses as meeting the requirements for certification. In order to become certified, in Maryland, as a Pest Control Applicator, Public Agency Applicator or Pest Control Consultant an individual must have at least one year of practical pesticide application experience as a registered employee in the category, or categories, in which he/she wants to become certified. A degree in a biological field such as biology, botany, horticulture, entomology, agronomy, etc. may qualify in lieu of the experience.

MDA felt that individuals completing these specific courses would obtain a good working background in pest control and pesticide use that would be equivalent to the one year of experience. In order for the course to be accepted towards the experience requirements the individual must at a minimum receive a grade of 70 per cent. A copy of the transcript must then be submitted with an application in order to be approved for certification.

Each of the following courses has been approved as meeting six months of the experience requirements. *In order for an individual to be eligible for certification they must complete the course that deals specifically with pesticide use and safety.* This course will count towards certification in any category.

The course selection for satisfying the other six months of required experience will be dependent upon the individuals needs. These courses have been approved for meeting the requirements within specific categories (e.g., Ornamental Plants and Shade Trees - Exterior Category 3A, Ornamental Plants - Interior Category 3B, Turf and Lawn Pest Control Category 3C, Public Health Category 8 or Agricultural Plant Category 1A). Completion of these courses cannot be used as meeting the experience requirements in other categories of pest control.

If a person wishes to become certified in only one category of pest control they will have to take the pesticide specific course and one other course approved for the category in which they want to become certified. However, if they wish to become certified in more than one category of pest control they must take the pesticide specific course, and one course approved for each of the categories in which they want to become certified (e.g. Pesticide Use and Safety, a course approved for Category 3A and one course approved for Category 3C, for a total of three courses).
