ATTENTION: Veterinarians: State law requires that: *“any person practicing veterinary medicine in the State shall report immediately to the Secretary any contagious or infectious disease among livestock or poultry of which he has knowledge. The report shall be in writing, and include a description of each animal affected, the name and exact address of the owner or person in charge of the animal, if known, the exact location of the animal, and number of susceptible domestic animals that have been exposed to the disease. The report shall be made within 48 hours after the person knows of the disease”* (§3-104b of the Annotated Code of Maryland)

Collect nasal swab, red top and purple top tubes. <p>American Foulbrood (<i>Paenibacillus larvae</i>)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> American Foulbrood is regulated and actionable by the MDA, with no antibiotics allowable in the active vegetative state. <p>European Foulbrood (<i>Melissococcus plutonius</i>)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> European Foulbrood is not actionable, but an antibiotic (Oxytetracycline, not Tylosin) is allowable. Reporting would be statistical only. ADT requires reporting of the beekeepers who are utilizing veterinary feed directives (VFD's) for antibiotic use. <p>Testing available via USDA ARS Beltsville Bee Lab at no charge.</p> <p>Notify MDA Animal Health and Apiary Services within 48 hours of sampling.</p> <p>***Any suspected Foreign Animal Disease not listed</p>	<p>Report dead or stranded marine mammals or sea turtles to NOAA, Ocean and Coasts Services by calling 410-226-5193</p>

*****Foreign Animal Diseases:** The diseases listed by WOA are considered by USDA APHIS to be foreign to the United States and must therefore be reported: [National List of Reportable Animal Diseases](#)
