

Q1 How do you define your involvement in Maryland Agriculture? (Select all that apply):





Q6 Where do you live in relation to your ag operation? (Distance in miles)







Q28 Has your farm been negatively impacted by deer damage?

Q38 If you answered depend on off-farm income, is your off farm job agrelated?





Q47 What do you think is the average Maryland citizen's perception of agriculture?




