

Q1 How do you define your involvement in Maryland Agriculture? (Select all that apply):








Q6 Where do you live in relation to your ag operation? (Distance in miles)

Q19 What is the highest degree of school you completed:





Q20 What language do you prefer to see communication?



Q21 Is English your first language?








Q35 How frequently do you use social media for your farm?












