Under section 201(f) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (FD&C Act) food is defined as (1) articles used for food or drink for man or other animals, (2) chewing gum, and (3) articles used for components of any such article. Examples of food include produce, eggs, dairy, meat, honey, processed or homemade foods (jams, pickled items, baked goods...), beverages, foods/drinks purchased for resale (commercially produced and/or purchased from other farms), sales of live food animals, and animal feeds such as pet milk, hay, silage, grain...
