This worksheet is for your use in determining if you are eligible for the Qualified Exempt status and documenting the required annual review per [21 CFR 112.7\(b\)](#). The Produce Safety Rule Qualified Exempt Registration Form (**page 2**) is required to be filed with MDA annually to exclude you from the inventory of farms required to fully comply with the Produce Safety Rule.

The Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA) is enforcing the U.S. Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) Produce Safety Rule through Maryland legislation that was effective July 1, 2019. Information on individual farms collected through this program will not be shared with any entities or persons outside of the MDA unless it is part of an active food borne illness outbreak investigation. All data collected concerning farms is shared with FDA as aggregate data only. I/we acknowledge the following:

- My/our farm was eligible for a qualified exemption based on total food sales for 2025, because the three-year average sales value of total food sales is less than or equal to \$665,947 (based on adjusted for inflation values of 2022, 2023, and 2024) and more than 50% of the total foods sales for the years 2022, 2023, and 2024 were to Qualified End Users.
- I/we are required to maintain records verifying our status as Qualified Exempt that may be inspected by the Maryland Department of Agriculture.
- I/we understand that we must establish and keep adequate records necessary to demonstrate that my/our farm satisfies the criteria for a Qualified Exemption that are described in [§ 112.5](#), including written records reflecting that I/we have performed an annual review and verification of my/our farm's continued eligibility for the qualified exemption (Page 1) per [§ 112.7\(b\)](#).
- I/we are required to submit the Qualified Exempt registration form annually to MDA to remain eligible for a Qualified Exemption.
- I/we are required by law to provide the name and complete business address of the farm where the produce was grown either on a label or at the point of sale while operating under the Qualified Exempt category per [§ 112.6\(b\)](#).
- I/we understand my/our Qualified Exempt status may be revoked if there is an active investigation of food borne illness linked to my/our farm and/or it is determined necessary by MDA and/or FDA to protect public health.
- Qualifying my/our farm for this exemption does not preclude me/us from following the requirements of the FDA Produce Safety Rule and Maryland Produce Safety Program.
- Qualifying my/our farm for this exemption does not exempt my farm from complying with all adulteration and other applicable provisions under the U.S. Food, Drug and Cosmetics Act.
- Qualifying my/our farm for this exemption does not exempt my/our farm from complying with other applicable Maryland and local laws and regulations.
