2026 Produce Safety Rule Qualified Exemption Registration Worksheet

This worksheet is for your use in determining if you are eligible for the Qualified Exempt status and documenting the required annual review per [21 CFR 112.7\(b\)](#). The Produce Safety Rule Qualified Exempt Registration Form (page 2) needs to be filed with Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA) annually to exclude you from the inventory of farms required to fully comply with the Produce Safety Rule.

Complete this worksheet (page 1) and retain for your records. Do not submit this worksheet (Page 1) to MDA.

1. Calculate your three-year average of gross FOOD sales. Gross food sales include all food for human and/or animal consumption, not just produce sales.

If your three-year average is greater than \$686,476 you are not eligible for this exemption. If your three-year average is less than \$686,476 move to next step.

Calculate sales to Qualified End Users (QEU) – Direct to consumer sales, restaurants and/or retail in Maryland OR not more than 275 miles from your farm; AND calculate sales to Non-Qualified End Users (NQEU) – Wholesale, Broker, or any sales including restaurant and/or retail more than 275 miles from your farm.
