The Maryland Produce Safety Program has adopted the U.S. Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) Produce Safety Rule (PSR) through Maryland legislation that was effective July 1, 2019. The Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA) will be conducting outreach, education, registration, inspection and enforcement activities for the PSR Information on individual farms collected through this program will not be shared with any entities or persons outside of the MDA unless it is part of an active food borne illness outbreak investigation. All data collected concerning farms is shared with FDA as aggregate data only. If you have questions concerning your eligibility, please review the Maryland Department of Agriculture "Produce Safety Rule Exemptions and Compliance Dates Fact Sheet" or contact MDA at (410) 841-5769 or produce.safety@maryland.gov. This worksheet is for your use to determine if you are eligible for the exemption and should not be submitted to MDA. The 2025 Produce Average Monetary Value of less than \$33,297 Exemption Registration Form (Page 2) must be submitted to MDA to exclude you from the inventory of farms required to fully comply with the PSR.

The PSR does not consider a farm or farm mixed-type facility with an average annual monetary value of produce sold during the previous 3-year period of less than \$33,297†as a "covered" farm. For this exemption, the baseline value was established in 2011 at \$25,000 and has been adjusted for inflation annually. The annual adjustment for inflation is posted to FDA's website every April for the previous year. The adjusted value for 2022 is \$32,240, for 2023 is \$33,415, and for 2024 is \$34,233. The three-year average maximum sales amount allowed for this exemption is \$33,297.

† On a rolling basis and adjusted for inflation; current value is based on adjusted inflation value for 2022, 2023 and 2024.
