Cover Crop Fact Sheet | Canola/Rape (Only as Part of Mix)

Canola (*Brassica napus*), also known as rapeseed, is a cool-season brassica that performs well in a cover crop mix. It improves ground cover in the fall and can naturally suppress certain weeds and pests through bio-fumigation. Other Brassicas may be eligible; contact local SCD before planting. In a mix, the crop with the earliest planting date sets the planting deadline. All mixes must include a cereal grain that makes up 50% of the mix.

Seeding Rates, Planting Dates, and Payment Options

Aerial - airplane, helicopters, drones, or ground-driven apparatus	5	3	Oct 10	\$50/ac

BCCP (Broadcast/cultipacker)	5	3	Oct 10	\$50/ac

Eligible Planting Methods

No-till	Use a no-till drill in undisturbed ground
Conventional	Prepare seedbed using tillage (plow, chisel, or disk), then drill the seed
Broadcasting with Light Tillage	Broadcast seed followed by light disking or a similar method to ensure seed-to-soil contact
Aerial - airplane, helicopters, drones, or ground-driven apparatus	Seed into a standing approved previous crop, and must use the aerial seeding rate
BCSC	Broadcast seed followed by stalk chopping (corn or sorghum only).
BCCP	Broadcast seed followed by cult packing (corn or sorghum only)

Fall Reporting Requirements

- A. Report planting to SCD within 1 week of completion
- B. Submit signed seed tags, seed tests, and/or aerial invoices for each species planted
- C. The deadline to submit fall documentation is **December 1**
- D. A partial payment for your cover crop is available in the fall upon request.

Spring Reporting Requirements

- A. Termination may begin after **March 1**
- B. Termination should be reported within 2 weeks of completion and by **June 1**
- C. All acres fall-certified must be reported in the Spring
- D. Spring claim will be issued based on acres spring-certified minus any fall payment
- E. The Spring payment will be processed after the final satellite imagery review and by July 1
