### **Additional Cost-Share Options**

Farmers who want to use different application rates or apply manure to crops not covered by our *FastTrack* grants should contact their soil conservation district, nutrient management consultant, or the Manure Transport Program to discuss other cost-share options to transport manure.

# What is the Manure Transport Program?

Maryland's Manure Transport Program provides cost-share grants to help cover the cost of hauling manure to qualifying farms or alternative use facilities that can use the product in an environmentally safe manner.

### **Who Can Apply:**

- Receiving farms that can use the manure as a nutrient source based on the farm's current nutrient management plan
- Manure brokers registered with the Maryland Department of Agriculture
- Alternative use facilities/operations







## FastTrack Grants to Transport Poultry Manure

Our new and improved *FastTrack* grants allow farmers with acceptable soil phosphorus levels (MD P Fertility Index Value of 100 or less) to haul poultry manure to their fields as soon as they need it using our *haul now, apply later* option.

### **RULES AND REQUIREMENTS**

- The sending farm must be located in Maryland and raise broiler chickens for one of the participating Delmarva poultry companies.
- Poultry manure must be transported more than seven miles from the sending farm.
- Transported poultry manure must be land applied as a nutrient source for an agricultural crop.

- Receiving farm fields are required to have a Maryland soil phosphorus Fertility Index Value of 100 or less.
- The cost-share rate is \$0.16/ton/mile for poultry manure coming from Dorchester, Somerset, Wicomico, and Worcester counties.
- The cost-share rate is \$0.14/ton/mile for poultry manure coming from all other counties.
- The maximum cost-share in all cases is \$28/ton.
- Eligible crops to receive poultry manure include corn, non-legume hay, and soybeans.
- Claims must be submitted no more than 40 days from the last day of transport.
- The maximum application rates are:
- 3 tons/ac for corn and hay
- 1.5 tons/ac for soybeans



# FastTrack Grants to Transport Dairy and Livestock Manure

Dairy and other non-poultry livestock producers with allowable soil phosphorus levels (MD P Fertility Index Value of 100 or less) may also apply for *FastTrack* grants featuring the *haul now, apply later* option.

#### **RULES AND REQUIREMENTS**

- Manure must be transported more than1 mile from the sending source.
- Only operations receiving the manure may apply for transport grants.
- Cost-share grants pay up to 87.5 percent of all eligible costs.
- Payment rates are based on the transport distance and type of manure, either liquid or solid.
- Receiving farm fields are required to have a Maryland soil phosphorus Fertility Index Value of 100 or less.
- Claims must be submitted no more than 40 days from the last day of transport.
- Manure must be applied to crops or hay fields containing less than 25 percent legumes.
- Grants to transport dairy and livestock manure are based on the following maximum application rates:
- 6,000 gallons per acre for liquid/slurry manure
- 10 tons per acre for solid/semi-solid manure

### Two Easy Options

**How to Apply for** *FastTrack* **Grants:** 

Our new and improved *FastTrack* grants allow poultry and livestock farmers to haul manure to their fields as soon as they need it. Choose from one of two *FastTrack* options:

**OPTION** Farmers download a *FastTrack* 

application from the Maryland Department of Agriculture's website and mail the completed application to the department

for cost-share approval. This is a good option for farmers who want to make sure that cost-share has been approved *before* they haul. After hauling is complete, farmers submit a claim for payment (forms can be downloaded from the website) to the Maryland Department of Agriculture.

**OPTION** Farmers who need to transport

manure to their fields right away can take advantage of the program's new *haul now, apply later* feature. This option allows

farmers to submit the application and claim for payment together, *after* the load has been hauled. Farmers are advised to read the rules carefully before choosing this option, as cost-share may be reduced or denied if manure is applied to ineligible fields.
