Project Description

Trapping volunteers responded to calls from caretakers for help with TNR in the targeted geographic area.

Summary of Approach

TNR cases came to us through a mixture of prior contacts and an interactive form accessible from our web site. In the course of the project we were able as a group to improve our cooperation with other groups. In particular, we worked across county lines with Laurel Cats and Beltsville Cats to organize transport of cats to and from clinics. We also tried to make our efforts more efficient by enlisting the caretakers themselves to do as much trapping as possible. All of our TNR activity in this project as well as others is tracked in a relational database. One of our trapping volunteers is a native Spanish speaker and was instrumental in coordinating with Hispanic caretakers.

Accomplishments

We met the proposed number of surgeries within the target zip codes of 20902, 20904, and 20906.

Lessons Learned

The work presented no real surprises, as the neighborhoods involved are familiar to our volunteers. The sheer usefulness of our database became more and more clear as the year proceeded, and we expanded the amount of information that we are tracking per case.
