Project Description:

This was a joint project involving the north Prince George's County TNVR groups Laurel Cats, Beltsville Community Cats (BCC), Bowie Citizens for Local Animal Welfare (Bowie CLAW), and Outlaw Kitties. Our four organizations performed trap-neuter-vaccinate-return (TNVR) activities in the northern part of Prince George's County, specifically Laurel, Bowie, Beltsville, College Park, Hyattsville, New Carrollton, Ladover Hills, Lanham, Glenarden, Seabrook, Riverdale Park, East Riverdale, Greenbelt, and Woodlawn). We traps cats in these areas, transported them to the vet, had them altered and vaccinated, and returned them to the site where they were located. When possible, friendly abandoned house cats and kittens young enough to socialize were diverted to our foster and rehoming programs rather than putting them back out.

Summary of Approach:

Unaltered cats and colonies of cats were identified through a combination of tips and door knocking. Once the number of cats needing surgery was identified, surgery slots were secured. Trappers worked with caretakers to collect the cats and also determine which might be candidates for rehoming vs. TNVR. Cats were transported to the clinic for surgery and then either back to a recovery space or a foster home. Feral cats were returned to their colony care site the day after surgery. Foster cats were placed up for adoption after and necessary socialization and additional veterinary care.
