The Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA), in collaboration with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, is offering **FREE RFID** (**Radio Frequency Identification**) **Tags & Taggers** to all Maryland Accredited veterinarians. We are providing free RFID tags to veterinarians, cattle and swine producers to improve disease traceability in Maryland and the U.S., and to improve the ability of Maryland producers to move livestock nationally and internationally. RFID tags allow producers, market operators, exporters, and veterinarians to identify cattle easily using electronic wands that record identification information without touching the animal. As a reminder, all livestock moving interstate must be identified using "Official Identification", which includes RFID tags.

To ensure traceability, we require that you log the tags that you apply or dispense to producers, and a copy of these logs to us monthly to we can enter tag information into a searchable database in case of a disease outbreak. To make this easier for you, we will supply a pre-printed list of tags by number, and a logbook to keep track of tags.

## **TO ORDER TAGS:**

- Email your request to <u>animal.disease.traceability@maryland.gov</u>, including your name and current associated address of business for premises identification, type of tags and number of tags requested, or
- Submit your request by calling the Animal Health Program at 410-841-5810.

All veterinarians requesting tags must register their business premises with MDA to obtain any Official Identification tags. Veterinarians who already have a premises registration – please provide address information so we can confirm we have the correct premises registration.

Veterinarians may request any type of RFID tag we have in stock, while supplies last. Please see the attached sheet for a description of available tags. Veterinarians and producers can always order tags at cost by contacting vendors listed here: <u>https://www.aphis.usda.gov/traceability/downloads/AIN\_device\_list.pdf</u>.
