Miscellaneous:

- Disciplinary Actions prior to 2010:
 - The Board is ok with beginning to incorporate public disciplinary actions prior to 2010 into the database so they may be viewed while searching for the veterinarian. This will be an ongoing project and will likely be delayed as the department is planning to shift the web hosting services in the near future.

• Prescribing/Dispensing Sedative for Fractious animals without a VCPR

- Is it ok if seen by another vet at the hospital? Not a refill.
 - If this is an existing client at the practice this would be acceptable.
- Is it permissible for a first time patient to receive a single dose of sedative for safe handling to be able to come in for an exam to establish a VCPR?
 - The regulations do not allow for medications to be prescribed without a prior VCPR. As with all cases, the Board would consider the circumstances when reviewing a complaint that involved a fractious animal. Hospitals may wish to refer to an inhome practice to establish a VCPR in these instances.

• Sixth attempt for NAVLE - Shyan Al Zuhairi

- The Statutes and regulations only require a passing score of the NAVLE but no requirements or limits to testing attempts.
- The Board has approved staff to sign these requests for confirmation as they come in and report them to the Board after they have been approved.

In a motion by Ms. Chaput, and seconded by Ms. Quimby, the Board motioned unanimously to adjourn the meeting to move into an administrative closed session to perform administrative functions outside the scope of the Open Meetings Act, in accordance with § 3-103(a)(1)(i) of the General Provisions Article. The administrative functions to be performed include discussion of the specific matters identified on the Board Agenda. In the alternative, I move to close the meeting pursuant to the following Section 3-305(b):
