- Prescription Food Inquiry Douglas Godesky
 - \circ $\;$ $\;$ The Board reviewed and approved the response sent to the inquiry.

"Prescriptions" for prescription pet food are not subject to the same requirements as prescriptions for medications. This is because prescription pet food is not medicine. However, these products are marketed and formulated with certain health conditions in mind including allergies, obesity, sensitive stomachs, and kidney disease. As such, these products are sold by or at the recommendation or direction of a veterinarian. These rules are based upon guidance issued by the federal Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and intended to avoid consumer misunderstanding about the use of the products as part of treating a diagnosed health condition. Because federal guidance requires veterinary oversight of the use of prescription pet food, it is not unreasonable for a veterinarian to sell or authorize the use and sale of such food when there is a valid veterinarian-client-patient relationship (VCPR). the Board believes that decisions whether to authorize or recommend prescription foods for patients' chronic medical conditions may be made by veterinarians based on their assessment of each patients' circumstances. The Board does not have a rule prohibiting veterinary practitioners from requiring annual examinations before the veterinarians authorize continued use of prescription food, nor do the regulations specifically require an examination in the past 12 months. Veterinarians may use their discretion in these situations.

• RVT Training Inquiry - Zoey Thompson

- The law still provides that non-credentialed staff (non RVTs) who are rendering auxiliary or supporting assistance under the responsible direct supervision of a veterinary practitioner (a Maryland-licensed and registered veterinarian) are not considered to be "practicing veterinary medicine" in violation of the Practice Act. Therefore, if your employer is in the immediate area and actively supervising your performance of the suturing skin wounds, or if you are assisting the veterinarian with dental extractions under the same immediate and active supervision while being trained, the Board would not consider this to be unlawful.

Legislation:

The Board reviewed legislation that may impact veterinarians/veterinary practices:

- <u>SB 233 Prescription Drug Monitoring Program Dispensers Veterinarians</u> this is the bill introduced in two past sessions that would make veterinarians "dispensers" within the meaning of the PDMP law and require them to report dispensing CDS (the Department's response will mirror what was submitted during the past session)
 - Bill withdrawn by sponsor.
- <u>HB 162/SB 380 Maryland Horse Industry Board Breeding Stables and Horse Establishments -</u> <u>Definitions (may be of interest) - Hearing February 2, 2025, at 2:00 p.m. - Environment and</u> Transportation Committee - Bill would require "breeding stables" to obtain a license issued by the MHIB and prohibit breeding stables from operating without a license. A "breeding stable" is defined to mean "an establishment in connection with which one or more horses are offered for sale to the public for breeding or as the product of breeding."
 - Bill is being withdrawn by sponsor.
- <u>SB 318 Higher Education Janet L. Hoffman Loan Assistance Eligibility Repayment Program -</u> <u>Eligibility</u> - This is similar to a bill introduced last year, for which there was no fiscal impact on the SBVME. Last year's version proposed to grant eligibility for a loan assistance repayment program to veterinary practitioners who work for the State for at least five years, or volunteer at least 100 hours per year for at least 3 years at a local animal control facility or shelter that receives Spay Neuter Grants services to the State. This year's version would also grant eligibility to both veterinary practitioners and veterinary technicians (RVTs) providing those services.
- <u>SB 80 Criminal Law</u> Animal Abuse or Neglect Penalties Senator Kramer In the Senate Hearing 1/16 at 1:00 p.m. Judicial Proceedings
- <u>SB 152 (HB 89) Criminal Law Crimes Relating to Animals Conviction and Sentencing</u> Hearing 1/09 at 2:00 p.m. Judicial Proceedings

In a motion by Dr. Calvert, and seconded by Ms. Quimby, the Board voted unanimously to adjourn the meeting to move into an administrative closed session to perform administrative functions outside the scope of the Open Meetings Act, in accordance with § 3-103(a)(1)(i) of the General Provisions Article.
