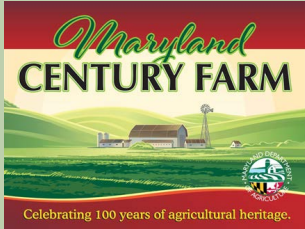


CENTURY FARM PROGRAM



To recognize Maryland's agricultural heritage of farm families who have operated the same farm for a century or longer.

Criteria

- The farm must be owned by the same family for at least 100 consecutive years to the date of the application; the farm must be lived on, or actually farmed by, a descendent of the original owner.
- The farm must consist of at least 10 acres of the original holding, and gross over \$2,500 annually from the sale of farm products
- Applications must include copies of legal descriptions, found in deeds, abstracts or tax statements, which indicate consecutive ownership.

Process

- Applications are available by contacting the Maryland Department of Agriculture or by visiting www.mda.maryland.gov
- Applicant completes and submits entry to the Maryland Department of Agriculture, Attn: Century Farm Program, 50 Harry S. Truman Parkway, Annapolis, MD 21401. A family may apply at any time throughout the year.
- The Century Farm Committee will review all the applications and approve eligible entries. The Secretary of Agriculture will certify approved applications, and recognize families annually. Application will be held at the Maryland Department of Agriculture for future research.

Benefits

Each family will be invited to participate in an awards ceremony conducted by the Secretary of Agriculture; receive a certificate signed by the Governor and the Secretary of Agriculture; be listed on the Century Farms plaque at the Maryland Department of Agriculture; and receive a sign suitable for posting on the farm (*Families eligible for listing in the State or National Registers of Historic Places receive additional benefits; see section*)

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Century Farm Historic Structures Award (Optional)

If your farm includes historic buildings or structures, you may apply for a special Century Farm Historic Structures Award. A farm qualifies if it has four standing buildings (house, barn, granary, chicken coop, etc.) or structures (windmill, corral, etc.) that are more than 100 years old and have not been significantly altered.

State and National Registers of Historic Places

The State and National Registers are lists of properties acknowledged by the Government as worthy of recognition and preservation for their significance in American history and culture, and are administered locally by the Maryland Historical Trust. Benefits of listing include formal recognition that a property is of significance; consideration in the planning for federally and state assisted projects and surface coal mining permits; eligibility for state and federal income tax benefits (investment, donation and rehabilitation); eligibility to apply for federal and state grants or loans for preservation projects.
